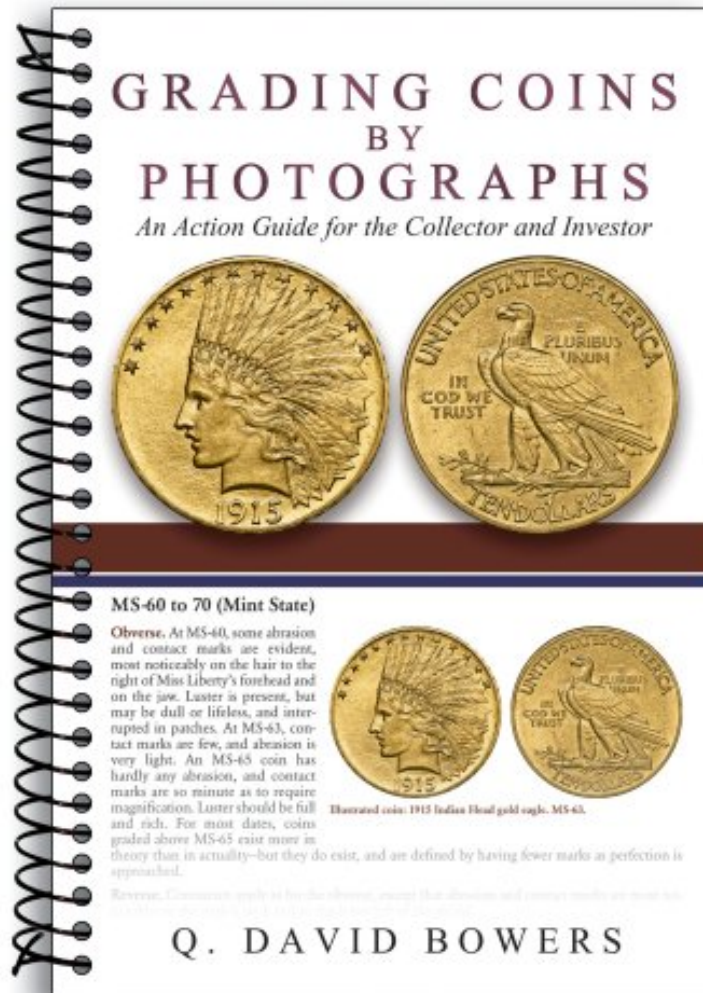

Even a certified coin can be a low grade or high grade within a grade. But having this book in my hands when searching ebay or whatever, gives me the advantage. Grading is not a science, but an art and everyone seldom agrees on the grade any given coin should get. The author stresses this. But having the knowledge you need to know what to look for in a coin is priceless.The author writes in a clear, easy-to-read style that quickly puts you up to

speed. In the first part of the book, you'll want to read what he says about grading and related topics. It's very valuable information and fun to read. The pictures are not the best in the world. But I've been using an old black and white grading book and even that is a tremendous help and has saved me lots of money and mistakes. So this one is far better. The important thing is, you see what to look for and avoid and you see what a coin should have to be a certain grade. You'll quickly be able to grade any coin with a high degree of accuracy. Each coin is pictured in the grade described. Then you read what to look for on the obverse and the reverse. It quantifies things that are really very fuzzy and subject to seller interpretation. Sure, the coin you're selling looks a lot better to you than to a buyer, so it's hard to be objective. This book helps inform the collector so they may buy better and buy at the right grade. For that reason, I give it a "two-thumbs up." Now, even within grade, there are prices and then there are prices. That book has yet to be written. So it is still a tough game for buyers. S The first rule is... take your time. Unable to use Kindle book version for grading By Jim Morgan I have not seen the actual book. I bought the Kindle version of the book to view on my Kindle for PC version. I was very disappointed when it came to using the photos for grading. First, I expected a recent edition of the book to contain more information other than the basic grades. Second, even on a large monitor (23 inch), I could not read the text with the photos as it was too small. I tried to increase the font size but since the text is actually part of the photo, I was not able to. I tried using a software-based magnifier to see the text and the photo but the resolution of the photo was so bad that this was useless. The photos are about the size or smaller of the coin that they represent so they were indeed small even on my large monitor. Grading Coins by Photographs
