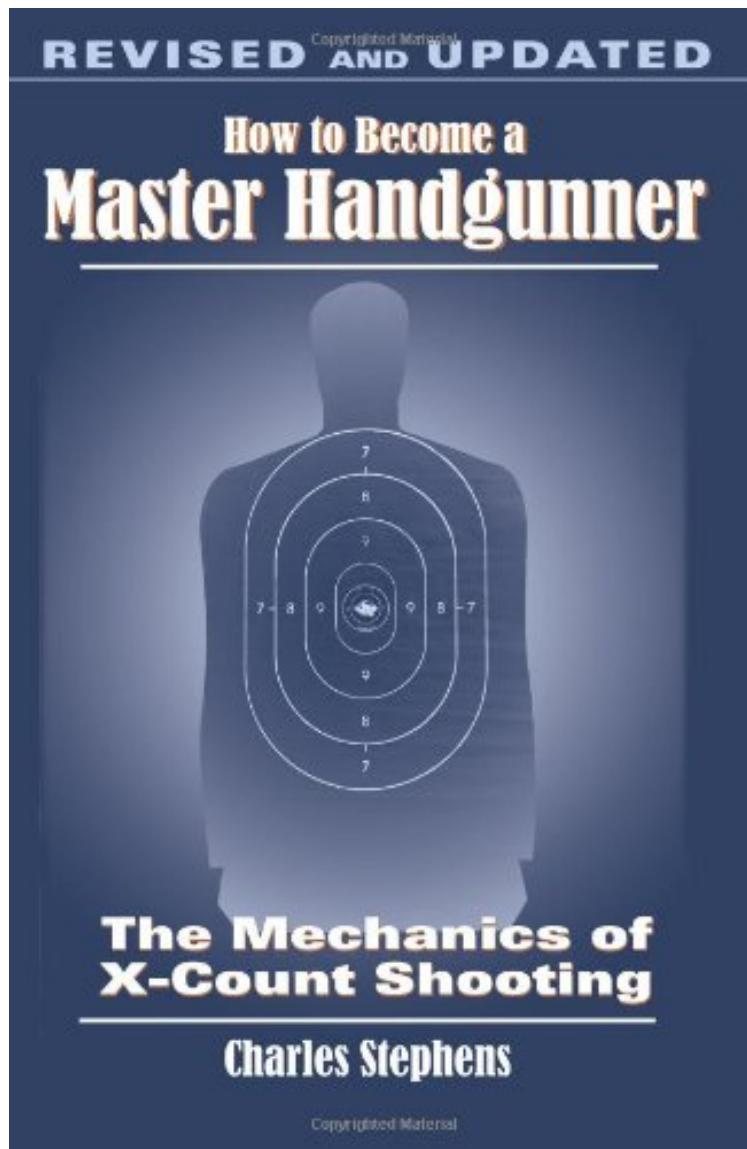

Unfortunately, all I got was a book full of the exact information and help I could already find on the internet at various gun/shooting websites and forums. If this wasn't bad enough Mr. Stephens's style is extremely repetitive and distracting. In one of the chapters of the book he begins a paragraph by stating, "Almost anyone who has learned to safely and accurately shoot a handgun well can do a reasonable job of hitting their intended target when firing from any of the basic defensive positions." Ok, well literally two paragraphs later he starts by saying, "Almost anyone who has learned to safely and accurately shoot a handgun can grasp a pistol with one or both hands and fire while pointing and aiming at a nearby target with a reasonable assurance of hitting it." That sounds oddly familiar, but not but another two paragraphs later he begins saying, "Almost any handgunner who has safely learned to fire a handgun accurately can master the mechanics and develop the skills to correctly and quickly aim the pistol and deliver hits on the target." Four paragraphs later is another sentence resembling the past three which I won't bother typing out as I'm sure you get the drift. In summary, don't waste your money and go do a Google search if you're looking for ways to improve your technique and accuracy.2 of 3 people found the following review helpful.
