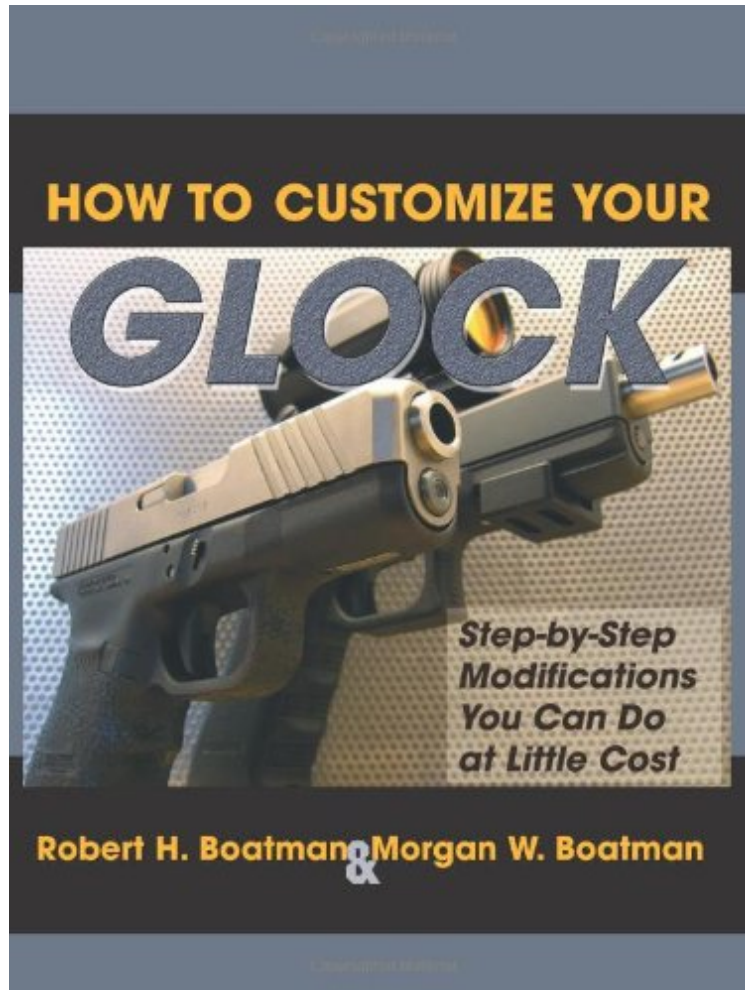

The problem is of course the book was titled "How to Customize your Glock:..." This made me (and apparently others) think the book would be address topics such; trigger jobs, frame modifications, fitting custom barrels etc... their is none of that here, only how to taker you pistol apart and put it back together. This left me dissappointed with my purchase. In the authors defense a lot of Glock "Customizing" IS simply changing items such as connectors and

springs, which this book would of course help you accomplish if you have never had yours apart before.
